Dear Community Members,

Sanford Clear Lake has conducted a community health needs assessment (CHNA) and formally identified unmet needs in the community. A component of the 2013 CHNA work is a perception survey.

During FY 2012/2013 members of the community were asked to complete a survey to help Sanford identify unmet health needs. Sanford analyzed the survey data, identified unmet needs, and partnered with key community stakeholders to develop a list of resources and assets that were available to address them. A gap analysis was also conducted to identify the most significant health needs, and they were addressed in the implementation strategy that is included in this document.

Sanford Clear Lake has set strategy to address the following community health needs:

- Cardiovascular Testing in Youth (Heart Screenings)
- Obesity

Sanford is also addressing mental health services and obesity through enterprise-wide implementation strategies. The enterprise strategies are included in this for your review.

Additionally, the asset map/resource list is included in this document along with the action steps that will be taken.

At Sanford Clear Lake, patient care extends beyond our bricks and mortar. Priority 1: Youth/Athletic Cardiovascular Screenings

Goal 1: Complete community education presentations on youth heart screenings.

Measurable Outcome:

 Education presentations are offered yearly to Kiwanis, Sanford Board of Directors,
 Community Club, Auxiliary Board, Deuel School staff, students and families beginning in FY 2013.

<u>Goal 2</u>: Arrange for all students in grades 6-12 at Deuel School in Clear Lake to have a heart screening completed.

Measurable Outcome:

• Heart screens are offered for students in grades 6-12 annually.

Goal 3: Arrange for the 6th grade class to have heart screening in January-February 2014.

- Letters sent to families of 6th grade students by December 15, 2013 explaining heart screening process, dates available and how to schedule. Will send out letters to families of students in grades 7-12 who did not complete the screening last year.
