Dear Community Members,

Sanford Worthington has conducted a community health needs assessment (CHNA) and formally identified unmet needs in the community. A component of the 2013 CHNA work is a perception survey.

During FY 2012/2013 members of the community were asked to complete a survey to help Sanford identify unmet health needs. Sanford analyzed the survey data, identified unmet needs, and partnered with key community stakeholders to develop a list of resources and assets that were available to address them. A gap analysis was also conducted to identify the most significant health needs, and they were addressed in the implementation strategy that is included in this document.

Sanford Worthington has set strategy to address the following community health needs:

- Youth Obesity
- Elderly
- New Americans/Immigrants

Sanford is also addressing mental health services and obesity through enterprise-wide implementation strategies. The enterprise strategies are included in this for your review.

Additionally, the asset map/resource list is included in this document along with the action steps that will be taken.

Addressing the Needs in Worthington

ACCESS

Community resources addressing the need:

- Current Sanford Medical Staff recruitment plan includes additional FPs and a Medical Oncologist.
- Increased number of specialty Sanford outreaches to Worthington including Cardiology, ENT, Pulmonology, Nephrology, Neurology, Physical Medicine, Allergy, Ophthalmology and Pediatric Cardiology have been established or enhanced this last year.
- Avera Health has a similar list of specialists visiting Worthington as well.
- Telehealth strategy is currently being set up to offer additional access to specialists in hospital and clinic.

<u>Goal 1</u>: Establish a youth program (K-4) that will involve District 518, YMCA, and local Sanford Worthington Clinic pediatricians and staff. Program is to be implemented in spring 2013. Action plans include focusing on kids with BMI above a certain percentage. Program to include physical activity for the kids as well as an educational component for parents. Curriculum is currently being developed. Review of program will occur with changes implemented, if any, for school year 2013-14.

Measurable Outcome:

Program is established and implemented during spring 2013 with ongoing evaluation

Priority 2: Elderly Services

<u>Goal 1</u>: Review and define the socio-economic-health status of the elderly in the community and develop an implementation strategy in FY 15 on need or needs identified. Actions include releasing summary of survey data to agencies that participated in the primary source community survey in first quarter FY 14.

Measurable Outcome:

• An assessment regarding the state of the elderly in Worthington is complete by FY 14 and data is shared with area agencies
