Program Description

The PALS course is designed to develop a system of priorities and rationales of treatment in the care of pediatric emergencies according to the standards and guidelines developed by the American Heart Association. The course will be a systematic review of the principles of assessment and the skill and treatment priorities necessary for the emergency management of the critically ill neonate, infant, and child. This is accomplished through a course utilizing lectures as well as hands on experience.

The PALS provider course will encompass knowledge and techniques, which are utilized in the definitive care of a critically ill neonate, infant, and child. Participation in this course enables the registrants to review didactic material as well as practical life-saving techniques and skills under the direction of an instructor in a simulated situation. Completion of the program in PALS is based on the criteria established by the American Heart Association.

Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the participant will be able to:

- Perform rapid cardiopulmonary assessment.
- Recognize signs of respiratory distress, respiratory failure, and shock in infants and children.
- Demonstrate use of various airway adjuncts and techniques.
- Recognize and manage unstable cardiac rhythms.

- Describe a sequential approach to establishment and management of IV/IO access in PALS.
- Review criteria and skills to perform BLS.
- Describe key elements of skills demonstrated and application of information.
- Recognize and manage significant rhythm disturbances.
- Recognize and manage respiratory failure in infants and children.
- Recognize and perform resuscitation of the newborn.
- Review questions and concerns regarding written exam.
- Describe key elements of skills demonstrated and application of information regarding children with special healthcare needs.
- Describe key elements of skills demonstrated and application of information regarding trauma and spinal immobilization.
- Describe key elements of skills demonstrated and application of information regarding coping with death.
- Demonstrate ETT.
- Demonstrate required PALS course knowledge and skills.
- Evaluate required PALS course knowledge and skills.
