HELPING CHILDREN WORK TOGETHER



Cooperation is the ability to balance one's own needs with someone else's. Cooperation means a joint effort – a give and take that is mutually satisfying.

How can you help children learn cooperation? It starts with helping them understand how our requests and rules are good for everyone. Below are examples of how children can develop the skill of cooperation.

Take Turns

Between 6 - 9 months, babies begin to engage in back-and-forth interactions. They also learn to imitate. This is a great time to encourage turn-taking as you play with the baby.

Explain Reasons for Limits and Requests

At three years old, most children use and understand language well enough to handle simple explanations. Point out how rules benefit everyone.

Give Specific Praise for Cooperative Efforts

Point out why and how their contribution was important. This helps them recognize and value their skills. "You helped pick up all the blocks, now we can go outside and play longer."

Take Time to Problem Solve

Help the other 2 - 3 year olds come up with solutions to everyday dilemmas and encourage cooperation at the same time.

- State the problem. "You want to draw on the paper that Cooper has?"
- Ask a question. "Where else could you draw?"
- Try a solution. Offer two options, both acceptable – perhaps on a different piece of paper or a cardboard box. If the toddler insists on drawing on Cooper's paper, set a limit. "I'll put away the crayons until we agree on a place to draw."

Offer Suggestions, Not Commands

Suggestions elicit cooperation. Commands often evoke resistance. "We need to pick up before we can go outside. Do you want to pick up the red blocks or the blue blocks?" This is likely to bring about a better response than saying "Help pick up."

Give Choices While Maintaining the Rules

"You need to go potty before going outside. Do you want to do it before or after snack?" Children are less likely to protest if they have a choice. Offering choices shows children respect, and respect creates a sense of collaboration.

Implementing these strategies into your daily interactions with children will help the develop strong teamwork skills to serve them for a lifetime
