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Reducing Challenging Behaviors

Encountering challenging children's behaviors in the classroom is not uncommon when working with children. The trick to calming the chaos in the classroom is understanding what triggers a child's behavior, and developing a behavior plan for the child when a pattern of inappropriate behavior starts to emerge. Developing a plan at the onset of the challenging behaviors is beneficial for the child and for those who care for the child.

Unfortunately, the child care industry is seeing a rise in children being expelled from child care programs due to challenging behaviors; something one used to think only happened in schools. Expelling a child from a child care program often happens because the child care staff are exhausted in having to deal with the child's behaviors.

Expelling a child may be a fix for the child care program, but isn't for the child. A child exhibiting challenging behaviors is a child asking for help. A child exhibiting continual challenging behaviors is likely feeling very stressed, angry or out of control of one's self. When children do not have the ability to identify and express these feelings with words, they often communicate them with emotional outbursts and inappropriate behaviors.

So how does one handle a child exhibiting challenging behaviors that continually take classroom teachers' time away from the other children?

- 1. The first step is to pause and observe. Ask questions such as:
 - What is triggering the behaviors?
 - When do these behaviors occur?
- 2. Next, seek to understand what the child is needing. Ask questions such as:
 - Is the child overtired or hungry?
 - Is the child worried?
- 3. Then, develop a plan of action to prevent and/or manage the behaviors.

With a behavior plan, a child exhibiting challenging behaviors can stay in his or her child care program where learning and development is encouraged. Sanford Children's CHILD Services has services that can help child care providers with developing a behavior plan, along with tips and techniques, to help minimize challenging behaviors in the classroom. These services include:

- Child observations
- Temperament screenings
- On-site technical assistance with staff

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- Assistance in developing a behavior plan for a child
- Parent consultations

Through these services parents, child care staff and CHILD Services staff work together to achieve the goal of helping a child succeed in his or her child care setting.

e-Learning Online Classes


