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Your Environment Matters

The physical environment in your program plays a huge role in the quality of your child care setting. You and the children in your program should find your environment welcoming and comfortable. A well designed and developmentally appropriate space sets the stage for learning and positive children interactions.

Consider these points when setting up your classroom's play space:

- Provide Predictability Children like to be in control of their own environment. Create a physical space in which children know what to expect. Minimize changes to the children's physical space. Change up the activities and toys offered, but maintain the room layout.
- Offer Organization Divide your space into different areas. Create a zone for messy activities, loud activities, quiet activities and active play. Separate areas that are opposite of each other such as loud and quiet play. When children can choose where they want to play, what they want to play with and have the ability to separate themselves into different areas, they are less likely to display challenging behaviors.
- Create Boundaries Create well-defined activity areas. This type of environment allows children to explore on their own and engage with different activities.
- Establish Paths Children need to be able to move quickly and easily from one activity to another. Entries and exits should be clearly defined. An open room without clear pathways doesn't provide children with a sense of direction and security and it can encourage children to run in the classroom. If you find yourself saying, "use your walking feet" on a regular basis, you may want to consider changing your pathways.

Setup an environment that provides children:

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- Safety Providing a safe environment encourages children to explore and learn about the world around them. Children should be able to move about freely and explore.
- Comfort and Convenience This allows you and the children to function without stress. A calm, carefree environment lets children play and learn all at the same time. Children learn to trust their environment and are able to learn easier.
- Child Sized Space Children should be able to reach, sit, play and work without always asking an adult for help. You should encourage children to become independent explorers. When children can access the materials they want to play with, it helps to develop their ability to be independent.
- Free Choice Opportunities for children to discover what they find interesting or challenging supports all areas of development. Children develop physically, emotionally, and socially when they are able to choose where and how they play.

To ensure accurate class registration, individuals must call to register for classes.

e-Learning Online Classes

- In order to receive credit for online classes, participants must:
- 1. Log into class within 5 minutes of the class start time.
- 2. Demonstrate attendance by participating in class polls and chats
- 3. Complete 3 learning statements at the end of the class.

Classroom Classes

- 1. Class participants arriving later than 10 minutes past the class start time will not be given credit for class attendance.
- 2. CHILD Services strives to provide a positive learning environment for all participants. If a class participant disrupts the positive learning environment, the participant risks not being given credit for the class.
- 3. CHILD Services respects the attention needs of young children and the learning needs of class participants. In order to maintain an appropriate learning environment for all class attendees, children are not allowed to attend classes with a class participant.

CPR Policy:

CPR payment must be received within 48 hours of the CPR class. If payment has not been received 48 hours in advance, you will be notified that your class reservation is no longer valid. This class reservation will be given to the first participant that secures this reservation with a payment.

CPR and First Aid Class Refund Policy:

CPR or First Aid class cancellation is required 24 hours prior to class, otherwise payment will be forfeited and is non-transferable.

CDA Renewal

CDA renewal fee is \$150 for paper renewal applications and \$125 for online renewal applications submitted through YourCDA.

When do I need to renew my CDA?

A CDA Credential is valid for three years from the date of award, each Credential issued after June 1, 2013 will need to be renewed every three years. Please remember, it is your responsibility to keep track of when you need to renew your CDA. Sanford Children's CHILD Services does not maintain renewal dates and will not be notifying you when your expiration is drawing near. You can go to **www.cdacouncil.org** and find out how to renew your certification.


