CDA - The Best First Step

What exactly is CDA?

Why should I get my CDA Credential?

CDA stands for Child Development Associate. CDA is a nationally recognized credential for people working with young children ages 0-5 in different types of settings – infant/toddler, preschool, Head Start and family child care. The National CDA vision is "to ensure that all professional early childhood educators and caregivers meet the developmental, emotional, and educational needs of our nation's youngest children."

Obtaining your CDA involves:

- 1. Completing 120 hours of specialized training in 8 subject areas (through online or classroom settings)
- 2. Putting together a Professional Portfolio (written Statements of Competence and Resource Collection Items)
- 3. Distributing Family Questionnaires

After the above three steps are completed, the next step is submitting an application to the National CDA Council. Once your application is approved, there is a Verification Visit (review of the portfolio, observation and reflective dialogue) and a CDA Exam.

There are many benefits in obtaining a CDA Credential:

- Your CDA credential is recognized nationwide and goes wherever you go.
- In South Dakota, several colleges allow CDA hours to count for designated college credit hours.
- Obtaining new knowledge and skills in the early childhood field benefits you and the children you care for.
- Having a CDA enhances your employment opportunities; some early childhood positions require the employee to have a CDA.

e-Learning Online Classes

In order to receive credit for online classes, participants must:

- 1. Log into class within 5 minutes of the class start time.
- 2. Demonstrate attendance by participating in class polls and chats

Classroom Classes






