☐ Keep the shiny objects such as hair straighteners and curling irons out of reach.

#### 4. MAGNETS AND BUTTON BATTERIES:

- ☐ Keep these items out of reach of children and pets.
- ☐ Seek medical attention immediately if you think a magnet or button battery has been swallowed.

#### 5. POISONING:

☐ Keep all household products, medications, bathroom hygiene products, paint, lawn care products, along with some plants out of reach of children and pets.

# ☐ Make sure you have a working smoke alarm

- on every level of the home, outside sleeping
- ☐ Have working CO alarms on each level of the

- ☐ Replace batteries in your alarms annually.

☐ Use the back of the stove to cook and keep pot and pan handles towards the back of the stove.
