

Sanford Children's Hospital Sanford Camping Program Service Description

Position Title: Sanford Children's Program Director & Assistant Program Director

Reports To: Camp Coordinator & Camp Medical Director

Purpose: The program director with assistance from the assistant program director designs and delivers all camp program activities and events under supervision of the Camp Coordinator, while assisting in the overall management of camp operations in a camp setting that may requiring working irregular hours. The program director with assistance from the assistant program director also promotes physical and emotional well-being of campers.

Days/Hours: Positions typically serve around 102+ hours via 8 days of in-session camp and staff training, as well as needed presence at 5+ pre and post-camp planning and implementing meetings starting as early as November.

Orientation and Training:

1. All hired camp staff members must complete a general orientation and staff training lead by the Camp Coordinator, Medical Director, and Program Director before the start of camp and camper arrival.

Special Requirements:

- Must be 21 years of age or older
- 2. Post-secondary education preferred.
- 3. All offers are contingent upon a successful background check.
- 4. Previous camp experience preferred.
- 5. Demonstrate the ability to be responsible, accountable, confidential and mature.
- 6. Committed to ensuring a fun, safe camping experience.

Responsibilities

- 1. Deliver a fun program to campers.
 - Ensure lesson plans are prepared and implemented that meet camp outcomes and the abilities of the campers.
 - Evaluate program delivery abilities of staff.
 - Deliver progressive program activities.
 - Evaluate the success of the program and the development of the campers' abilities and skills in various program activities.
 - Coordinate all camp program and campfire activities with other staff.
 - Attend administrative staff meetings.
 - Maintain clear and positive written and verbal communication with all camp staff.
 - Participate in all camp activities, providing support and guidance to those assigned as leaders.
 - Participate as a member of the camp staff team to deliver and supervise evening programs, special events, overnights, and other all-camp activities and camp functions.



- Provide ongoing program ideas to counseling and activity area staff.
- 2. Ensure that camp staff and campers know and follow safety and educational procedures during camp programs.
 - Lead the implementation of staff training.
 - Provide guidelines for programs utilizing camp equipment.
 - Ensure campers and staff follow safety procedures in all program areas.
- 3. Assist in the management and care of the physical facilities and equipment in all program areas.
 - Oversee daily checks of area and equipment for safety, cleanliness, and good repair.
 - Ensure that program areas are kept free of hazards and debris.
- 4. Supervise and evaluate Program Specialists to develop and implement all facets of camp program activities
 - Regularly monitor work of program specialists.
 - Provide feedback and guidance to program specialists.
 - Provide recommendations and concerns to Children's Camping Coordinator regarding program specialists' performances.
- 5. Develop and implement schedules and records for all areas of camp program and facilities.
 - Create camper and group program and activity schedules.
 - Develop and supervise staff schedule for programs and activities.
 - Collect and evaluate records; report and evaluate camp program and activity areas.

Physical Aspects & Requirements:

- 1. Standing and walking frequently on tile or carpeted floors and outdoors on grass, pavement, and gravel.
- 2. Lifting and carrying of the following: occasionally 50lbs, frequently 25 lbs., and constantly 10 lbs.
- 3. Spending 10+ hours in outdoor conditions (sun, wind, etc.)
- 4. Apply 35 pounds of push/pull force (for patients in wheelchairs up to 180 pounds) occasionally to frequently. Two additional pounds of push/pull force is required for each additional 20 pounds of patient weight.
- 5. Ability to lift and transfer individuals in wheelchairs.
- 6. Ability to observe camper behavior, assess appropriateness, enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures, and apply appropriate behavior-management techniques.
- 7. Ability to observe staff behavior, assess appropriateness, enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures, and apply appropriate management techniques.
- 8. Physical ability to respond appropriately to situations requiring first aid. Must be able to assist campers in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, or injury) and possess strength and endurance required to maintain constant supervision of campers.
